Wed, Nov. 3

UNITED STATES TO DUBLIN

This evening depart Newark Airport on Continental Flight #126 at 9:50 pm. Soon you're over the New England coastline where you begin your transatlantic flight to Dublin. Dinner will be served en route.

Thu, Nov. 4

DUBLIN ARRIVAL & SIGHTSEEING

Welcome to Ireland! You arrive in Dublin at 8:25 am. After clearing immigration and customs you will be met in the Arrivals Hall by your driver/guide. Set off with a local guide who will show you around the prominent historic buildings and monuments of Dublin. Dublin is an ancient settlement, founded by the Vikings in the 9th century. The city has been molded through the centuries with many architectural styles, reflecting the economic, political and artistic influences. Stop to visit the Guinness Storehouse to see exhibits on how this world famous stout was first created and why it is so popular today. Finish your visit in the roof-top bar, Gravity, overlooking the city center where you can sample a draft Guinness and enjoy the view of the city. Then drive to your hotel and check in. After you settle into your room you may like to rest or explore some of the city on your own before dinner.

DINNER & OVERNIGHT: CAMDEN COURT HOTEL, DUBLIN

Fri, Nov. 5

GLENDALOUGH

Now well rested we set out this morning for a visit to the 6th century monastic ruins of Glendalough, where the peacefulness of the valley conjures up the spirit of the monks. The Visitor Centre explains how St. Kevin founded this settlement at a time when Christianity was burgeoning throughout Ireland. Today the monks have long gone, leaving the ruins of numerous churches and a round tower. Return to Dublin where the balance of the day and evening are at leisure for independent activities and dining.

OVERNIGHT: CAMDEN COURT HOTEL, DUBLIN

Sat, Nov. 6

KILMAINHAM GAOL & ABBEY TAVERN EVENING

This morning visit Kilmainham Gaol to see what punishment was like during its years of operation from 1796 to 1924. Learn about political prisoners, especially from the 1916 Rising, detained here because of their efforts to shape Ireland's history. Then enjoy the balance of the afternoon at leisure in Dublin where you can choose from a wide variety of pursuits. There are plenty of museums of Irish interest such as the National Museum, the National Gallery or the Writers Museum. There are plenty of shops along Nassau Street and the pedestrianized Grafton Street or Henry Street and you may like to explore Temple Bar or visit some of the traditional pubs. This evening head to the Abbey Tavern for dinner and a traditional ballad session. The drive to Howth, a suburb on the north side of the city will give you great views of Dublin Bay. Built on the site of an old abbey, this pub has been in business for over 200 years.

Sun, Nov. 7

RETURN HOME OR DUBLIN TO CONG

For those departing today you will be transferred back to Dublin Airport in time to check in for Continental Flight #127 departing at 10:55 am. Meals will be served en route and soon you'll be arriving in Newark at 1:40 pm.

For those lucky enough to be staying for the extension you will travel across Ireland from east to west today. Drive through the fertile midland region, which has many farms and marketing towns. All along the way you can see how Irish people make a living from agriculture, one of the most important sources of revenue for Ireland. Travel through the towns of Moate and Athlone to the attractive village of Cong. Upon arrival check into Ashford Castle Hotel which dates from the 13th century but today offers every modern comfort and a full range of sporting activities, including golf and horseback riding. Enjoy the balance of the afternoon free to enjoy these luxurious surroundings. In the evening join your fellow travelers for a superb dinner in the castle's fine restaurant.

Mon, Nov. 8

GALWAY TOUR & CLIFFS OF MOHER

Leaving Cong travel via Headford to the bustling city of Galway. Enjoy a panoramic tour to see the principal sights of the city. A drive around will take you to the large modern cathedral set on an island on the River Corrib. See the Spanish Arch in the Claddagh area, formerly a fishing village, the City Museum, National University of Galway and the Cathedral of Our Lady, which is built on the site of the former county jail. Then drive around the shores of Galway Bay and through the Burren Country, a unique region of limestone hills where many rare flowers thrive in the sheltered crevices. Stop at the Cliffs of Moher, a wall of rock that plunges 700 feet to the churning Atlantic Ocean below. Travel inland to Ennis and check into your hotel where the balance of the afternoon is at leisure before dinner.

Tue, Nov. 9

ADARE & BUNRATTY

Arise and have a leisurely breakfast before setting out for a tour of Limerick City and a visit to the village of Adare with its thatched cottages along Main Street. After this our next stop will be Bunratty where you can shop, have a pint at Durty Nellie's Pub or visit the Folk Park. Afterwards we return to Ennis. Tonight you are free to dine in any of the town restaurants or pubs.

Wed, Nov. 10

RETURN TO THE UNITED STATES

This morning transfer to Shannon Airport for Continental's Flight #25 departing at 9:00 am. Soon the green fields fall away as you cross over the west coast of this island and head out over the Atlantic. A meal will be served en route. So, just close your eyes and relive the past week and in what seems a very short time you're approaching Newark for an 11:25 am. arrival.

A valid passport good for 6 months after date of return (May 11, 2011) is required for this trip.

Conditions

A deposit of \$250.00 per person (\$369.00 if purchasing insurance) is due along with the completed application to confirm your place. Final payment is due by September 3, 2010.
